What's been done to date?

- Series of council meetings
 - » Olsson Associates: developed watershed and in/near lake alternatives
 - » Technical Advisory Team: provided guidance using their expertise and experience
 - » CLEAR Council: formed subcommittees, provided feedback, insight and discussion
- CLEAR Council approved recommended alternatives on December 4, 2007 and January 23, 2008
- March 11, 2008- Public input



Why is this necessary?

- State list of impaired waters
- Impaired waters must be addressed by state agencies
- Determine acceptable pollutant levels and compare to existing pollutant levels
- EPA review
- Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL)
- Associated permits
- Implement Best Management Practices (BMPs)




